Reservations and Payment: You are encouraged to mail your reservation without delay. Reservations will be confirmed by American Travel Association (ATA) upon receipt of the Reservation Form and a \$100 per person deposit. Receipt of final payment is due in the office of ATA no later than 60 days prior to the tour departure. All payments must be made by check payable to American Travel Association or by Visa, Mastercard or American Express.

Cancellation: Cancellations must be made in writing to ATA. To avoid discrepancies, ATA will not act on information given over the phone until written notice has been received. A \$50 per person cancellation fee will be charged on cancellations regardless of the reason. Penalty on cancellations received after 60 days prior to arrival will be a maximum of 100% of the land cost per person, depending upon the amount recoverable from the suppliers to whom payment had been sent. Cancellation penalties are required to offset non-refundable hotel and supplier payments made by ATA in advance of the tour. There will be no refund for unused services once the tour has begun.

Responsibility: American Travel Association (ATA), the American Society of Reproductive Medicine (ASRM) and/or their agents, act only on behalf of the owners and contractors providing means of transportation or other services to purchasers of this tour and their travel companions (Participants), subject to any and all items and conditions under which any transportation or any other services whatsoever are provided by such owners and contractors. ATA and ASRM shall not be liable or responsible to Participants for any loss, injury or death, or other damages caused by or resulting from acts of God, fire, breakdown of machinery or equipment, acts of governments and other authorities, wars, strikes, riots, thefts, epidemics or quarantines, monetary crisis, diseases, terrorism or novel conditions.

Prices: This price is subject to change due hotel and transportation cost increases, and in the number of participants upon which the tour cost is based (30). ATA reserves the right to increase the price for such reasons.

Insurance: Trip cancellation, baggage and medical insurance coverage is available for purchase through a form to be sent by ATA. We strongly recommend insurance coverage. When last minute illnesses occur, the insurance helps offset non-refundable air and land charges. You might also check with your local insurance agent to see what is covered under your homeowner's policy.

Health: A letter of explanation of a physical or mental condition that may require medical attention or special equipment (wheelchair for example) must be enclosed with the reservation form. There is a moderate amount of walking required to see the attractions as outlined in the itinerary. Some of the walking is on uneven surfaces and some of the places we visit are not wheelchair accessible.

ITINERARY

Savannah, GA Oct. 22-24, 2009

DAY 1 ATLANTA TO SAVANNAH

- Our tour bus will schedule hotel pick-ups for the beginning of our journey through the middle of Georgia. Our first stop is Macon for a guided tour of historic Hay House. Designed in 1855, this Italian Renaissance Revival palazzo has been home to three important Macon families; its' rooms cover 18,000 square feet. After lunch, we resume our ride to Savannah.
- Mid-afternoon arrival in Savannah and check-in, Hampton Inn or Holiday Inn . The hotels enjoy perfect locations on East Bay Street. The City Market and other shopping and restaurant areas are just outside the back doors, and the river is a 5 minute walk across Bay Street and through the park.
- There will be time for exploring before enjoying the Southern Buffet Dinner at The Lady & Sons. If you don't see Paula Deen while there, look for her on the Food Network. (L,D)

DAY 2 SAVANNAH

- Breakfast is included and taken at your leisure.
- The day is yours to explore Savannah. (See **Optional Tours**) Spend all or part of the day learning about Savannah's rich and colorful history. Included in the package is a "hop-on" pass which entitles you to boarding privileges at 14 trolley stops that are convenient to the historic points of interest, unique shops and fabulous restaurants. As you ride the trolleys you'll learn about Savannah through informative narration offered by your drivers.
- Lunch and dinner are on your own. A list of recommended restaurants will be provided. Your hotel is well located and within easy walking distance of a variety of good restaurants (B)

DAY 3 SAVANNAH TO HOME

Again, breakfast is included and taken at your leisure. Everyone is on their own to transfer to the airport for their flights home. There are flights from Savannah to major cities and there are numerous flights in the morning and afternoon to Atlanta, where you can connect home. (B)
